OSHA Proposes Revised Rule on Hexavalent Chromium

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration published a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking for occupational exp osure to hexavalent chromium, also known as CrVI. The major health effects associated with exposure to CrVI include lung cancer, asthma, nasal septum ulcerations and perforations, skin ulcerations (known as chrome holes), and allergic and irritant contact dermatitis.

CrVI is widely used in the chemical industry in pigments, metal plating, and chemical synthesis as ingredients and catalysts. Exposures in the foundry environment become likely during welding operations, particularly on stainless steel or CrVI painted surfaces.

Major provisions of the proposed standard can be located at OSHA.gov and include many provisions similar to OSHA's lead standard including exposure monitoring requirements, regulated area, & protective work clothing. Perhaps the most shocking aspect of the proposal is a reduction in the permissible exposure limit from 52 micrograms to 1 microgram per cubic feet of air as an 8-hour time-weighted average.

A comment period is in effect until January 3, 2005 with informal public hearings conducted in Washington, D.C. beginning February 1, 2004.


